## ***Different Time, Different Places—David Carlson comes to McLean***

Sunday, November 30, 2008, McLean, Virginia – The TaBois–Bonhomme Galerie d’Art celebrated it’s First Anniversary with *An Enchanted Evening* on November 22<sup>nd</sup>, and now announces its final exhibition for 2008: ***Different Time, Different Places, featuring the paintings of David Carlson*** at its gallery located in the Regency at McLean, 1800 Old Meadow Road, Suite 113, near Tysons Corner.

From December 6 – 21, 2008, in conjunction with a book-signing event for the release of McLean’s **R.A. Comunale, M.D.’s** third novel, *Legend of Safehaven*, and **Jake Jacobs’ *Terracotta Figures & Portraits***, the gallery will feature paintings by David Carlson, an internationally and nationally recognized artist whose work has been shown in the Netherlands, China, Senegal, Belgium, Bulgaria, Egypt, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Germany, Morocco, Italy, and South Africa. Mr. Carlson, whose paintings have been featured in juried and curated exhibitions, most recently at the MPA Artfest last October, returns to McLean for a solo exhibition at the TaBois-Bonhomme Galerie d’Art.

Mr. Carlson’s work has an undertone of geometry to it, not in a classic sense, but on a more esoteric and poetic level. His work is infused with the concepts of time, energy, and space, influenced by his travel to other countries, Taoism, and Buddhism.

They are mediations, based upon the process of painting the collision of random sequence and change.

David Carlson is an adjunct professor at Marymount University, where he teaches courses in fine arts. He has served on numerous boards: the Greater Reston Arts Center, the Arlington Arts Center, and the Central Asian Cultural Exchange.

In addition, *Terracotta Figures & Portraits by Jake Jacobs* will be displayed in the adjoining gallery. Mr. Jacobs began sculpting fifteen years ago after a career in the military and engineering.

*Different Time, Different Places, Paintings by David Carlson and Terracotta Figures & Portraits by Jake Jacobs* will commence with an Opening Reception on December 6<sup>th</sup> from 7 p.m. to 11 p.m. The book-signing event for R. A. Comunale, M.D. will be held on December 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., featuring his novels, *Requiem for the Bone Man*, *Berto's World*, and *Legend of Safehaven*, all of which were included the National Press Club's Book Fair on November 18<sup>th</sup> in Washington, D.C.

Gallery hours during the exhibitions are Tuesday and Friday, 7:30 p.m. – 10 p.m., Saturday noon – 7 p.m., and Sunday 1 – 5 p.m., and by appointment.
